

The Tree of Life

Overview: God says to choose life or death (Deut 30:19). We choose by eating of the Tree of Life. We do this by speaking words with a wholesome tongue, words of Grace and words which agree that we have been justified (i.e. made righteous) by Jesus Christ.

- A. God's will for man's life.
 - 1. In the beginning.
 - Gen 1:31 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, [it was] **very good.** Gen 1:28 God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over every living thing that moves upon the earth.
 - 2. At the end.
 - Rev 21:4 And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be **no more death**, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain:
 - 3. In Heaven.
 - Psa 16:11 Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence [is] fulness of joy; at thy right hand [there are] pleasures for evermore.
 - 4. Today, on Earth.
 - Mat 6:10 Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as in heaven (no death in Heaven).
- B. Man's choice of life or death.
 - 1. The Choice.
 - Acts 10:34 God is no respecter of persons.
 - Deu 30:19 I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, [that] I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both you & thy seed may live:
 - 2. Adam's choice.
 - Gen 2:16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou may freely eat: v17 But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.
 - 3. The choice today.
 - Mar 16:15 he said, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. v16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. Act 2:21 It shall come to pass, whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved. Joh 8:31 Jesus said to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, [then] are ye my disciples indeed; v32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. Joh 11:25 Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:
 - Joh 11:26 And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?
 - 4. The Final choice.
 - Joh 14:6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life:
 - Matt 11:12 AMPC And from the days of John the Baptist until the present time, the kingdom of heaven has endured violent assault, and violent men seize it by force [as a precious prize—a share in the heavenly kingdom is sought with most **ardent zeal and intense exertion**]. Rom 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but **be ye transformed** by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what [is] that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. 1 Cor 15:51 AMPC Take notice! I tell you a mystery (a secret truth, an event decreed by the hidden purpose or counsel of God). **We shall not all fall asleep [in death],** but we shall all be changed (transformed)





1Th 4:16 For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:

1Th 4:17 Then we which are alive [and] remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.

Rev 21:7 He that overcomes shall inherit **all things**; I will be his God, and he shall be my son.

C. Eating of the Tree of Life.

Pro 4:23 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it [are] the issues of life.

Mat 12:34 out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks.

1. The Tree of life.

Gen 3:22-24 3 Adam barred from the Garden, lest he eat of the Tree of Life and live forever.

Rev 22:1,2 The Tree of Life with 12 fruits for the healing of the nations.

Prov 11:30 The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life.

Prov 15:4 Amp A wholesome tongue is a tree of life.

2. The Tongue Guides Your Life.

Jm 3:2-10 Your tongue guides your life as a rudder does a ship.

Prov 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue.

Jam 3:2 For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same [is] a perfect man, [and] able also to bridle the whole body.

Jam 3:3 We put bits in the horses' mouths, that they may obey us; and we turn about their whole body. v4 Behold also the ships, which though [they be] so great, and [are] driven of fierce winds, yet are they turned about with a very small helm, wherever the governor points.

3. Your tongue is a creative force.

Gen 1:26 You are made in the image and likeness of God.

Rom 4:17 Create what you need by calling things that be not, as though they were.

Jam 3:5 Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasts great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindles!

Jam 3:6 And the tongue [is] a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.

Jam 3:7 For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind:

Jam 3:8 But the tongue can no man tame; [it is] an unruly evil, full of deadly poison.

4. You eat of the Tree of Life (i.e., live free of death) by your words.

Mat 12:36 But I say unto you, That <u>every idle word</u> that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment.

Mat 12:37 For **by thy words thou shalt be justified**, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

Mark 11:23 You have what say; so say what you want. Speak life and not death to yourself. Rom 4:17 (As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations,) before him whom he believed, [even] God, who quickeneth the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were.

Rom 4:18 Who against hope believed in hope, that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be.

Rom 4:19 And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb.

Rom 4:20 <u>He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief</u>; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God;

Rom 4:21 And being fully persuaded that, what God had promised, he was able also to perform.
