

The Anointing on You

Overview: The Anointing destroys the work of the devil when words of faith are spoken out of a person upon whom the Spirit rests. The Anointing on you is primarily for ministry to others through the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

A. The Holy Spirit on the Believer

The Holy Spirit has fallen on men and women of God ever since the Age of Law from the time of Moses until now. However, because of ongoing occasions of sin, the Holy Spirit has eventually lifted off all of them. Jesus was the only one who did not sin and so He was the only one on whom the Holy Spirit remained.

1. Before Jesus.
 - a) The Spirit of the Lord came upon Samson. Judges 15:13-15
 - b) The Spirit of the Lord on David; departed Saul. 1 Sam 16:13
 - c) The hand of the Lord was on Elijah. 1 Kings 18:44-46
 - d) The Spirit doth rest upon Elisha. 2 Kings 2:9-11, 15
2. During the ministry of Jesus.
 - a) The Holy Ghost shall come upon Mary. Luke 1:35
 - b) Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost. Luke 1:41 (4130)
 - c) Zacharias was filled with the Holy Ghost. Luke 1:67 (4130)
 - d) John filled with the Holy Ghost from the womb. Luke 1:15 (4130)
3. After Jesus was resurrected.
 - a) Disciples were all filled with the Holy Ghost. Acts 2:4 (4130)
 - b) Then Peter, filled with Holy Ghost. Acts 4:8 (4130)
 - c) Stephen, full of the Holy Ghost did great wonders. Acts 6:8 (4134)
 - d) Barnabas full of the Holy Ghost. Acts 11:24 (4134)

B. The Holy Spirit on Jesus

1. The Spirit of God descended on Him. Mark 1:10; John 1:33
2. The Spirit lighting upon Him. Matt 3:16
3. Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost. Luke 4:1 (4134)

Note: From Strong's Concordance.

4130 Pletho: defined as fill, supply, furnish.

Used 24 times in the NT.

3 times as accomplished or full time has come. (Mt 2:6)

7 times as in filled with wrath (Lk 4:28), with fear (Lk 5:26), with madness (Lk 6:11), with fish (Lk 5:7), with wonder Acts 3:10; or furnished with guests (Mt 22:10).

14 times filled with Holy Ghost; typically followed with speaking, teaching or prophesying.

4134 Pleres: defined as replete (*filled to excess, overflowing*), covered over, complete, full.

Used 18 times in the NT.

7 times as in overflowing with full baskets, full ear of corn, full of leprosy full of grace;

6 times as in seeming to be overflowing with HS with 2 of those including grace or power, typically followed by miraculous experiences, but not by speaking.

C. The Holy Spirit on You

1. Receive the Holy Ghost – Spirit in, born again. John 20:19-24
2. Tarry in Jerusalem for power - Spirit on, ministry. Luke 24:49
 - a) Least in the Kingdom is greater than John. Luke 7:28
 - b) The fullness of the Godhead bodily. Col 2:9
3. Expect the same as disciples received, when they were filled: Acts 1:8, 2:3,4
 - a) Speak in Tongues.
 - b) The Holy Spirit to sit upon you.
 - c) Minister to others in power with signs and wonders.

D. The Anointing on You

1. The Spirit descended and remained on Jesus without lifting off. John 1:32, 33
 Joh 1:32 And John bare record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him.
 Joh 1:33 And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and **remaining on him**, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost.
2. Who does the baptizing in the Holy Ghost? Matt 28:19, Acts 19:6
 Matt 28:19 We, as representatives, of Jesus are to baptize others in the Holy Spirit.
 Act 19:6 And when Paul had laid [his] hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spoke with tongues, and prophesied.
3. The Holy Spirit will remain on you without lifting off if you avoid sinning.
 - a) You avoid sinning by living your life in accordance with the Fruit of the Spirit. If you sin, confess it immediately; then ask the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on you. Gal 5:22, 23
1 John 1:9
 - b) You are the righteousness of God in Christ. Try to live like it. 2 Cor 5:21
 - c) You are an ambassador of Heaven. Try to live like it. 2 Cor 5:20
 - d) Speak the Gospel boldly for you are an ambassador of Jesus. Ephesians 6:19,20
 - e) Do not quench (suppress nor subdue) the Holy Spirit. 1 Thess 5:19 (Ampl)
 - f) Grieve not the Holy Spirit by ungodly words. Eph 4:29,30

Suggestion: Each time when you confess your sins according to 1 John 1:9, immediately after confessing them, pray that the Spirit of the Lord will fall afresh upon you.
