


The Rod of Iron Brings Victory

A. Types of Sin.

Psa 103:3 Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases; Lev 20:10 And the man that committeth adultery with [another] man's wife, [even he] that committeth adultery with his neighbour's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death.

Isa 53:5 But he [was] wounded for our transgressions, [he was] bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace [was] upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.



Scriptures (SCR 1 – 5)

- 1 Rom 4:15 Because the law worketh wrath: for where no law is, [there is] no transgression.
- 2 Gen 2:17 But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.
- 3 Gen 17:11 And ye shall circumcise the flesh of your foreskin; and it shall be a token of the covenant betwixt me and you.
- 4 Mat 12:35 A good man out of the good treasure of the heart brings forth good things: an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things. Jam 3:6 And the tongue [is] a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of he
- 5 Mat 7:23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.
- * Note: 1Jo 3:4 Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law. I believe that this, being in the New Testament, is referring to the Law of Love.
- ** Note: Psa 90:8 Thou hast set our iniquities before thee, our <u>secret sins</u> in the light of thy countenance.



B. Rod of Iron.

- 1. Difference between Transgressions and Iniquities.

 Transgression is a violation of the Law of God. Iniquities are a result of twisted thinking or immorality of one's heart, which result in moral wrongfulness (of character, life or act).
- 2. The penalty under law for a transgression is death, immediately; or eventually, if covered over by the atoning blood of the sacrifice.
- 3. Ps 103:3 states God forgives our iniquities but nothing about transgressions.
- 4. Examples of Transgressions and death.

Adam ate the fruit.

Abraham took Lot with him.

Moses hit the rock instead of speaking to it.

Taking the mark of the beast and worshipping the beast is death.

5. Examples of iniquities and life.

All have sinned but:

Enoch walked with God and God took him.

Elijah went up to Heaven attended by a chariot of fire.

Those who are alive and remain will be raptured.

C. Let your words be a Rod of Iron.

- 1. Joh 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have [it] more abundantly. (Life better than you have ever dreamt it. MSG)
- 2. Eph 3:20 KJV Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us. Ephesians 3:20 Amplified Bible (AMPC)

 Now to Him Who, by (in consequence of) the [action of His] power that is at work within us, is able to [carry out His purpose and] do
 - **superabundantly**, far over and above all that we [dare] ask or think [infinitely beyond our highest prayers, desires, thoughts, hopes, or dreams]
- 3. Joh 15:7 If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.
- 4. Eph 4:29 Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister **grace** unto the hearers.
 - Eph 4:30 And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. (*i.e.*, *until the Rapture*).
- 5. Mar 11:23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall **say** unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith (*ongoing*) shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he **saith**.
