

Partnering with God

Overview: Your Salvation Package is full of God's promises. Each promise in the Bible has one or more conditions; meet the conditions and you get the promise.

A. Promises in your Salvation Package.

All the wonderful blessings in the Bible belong to anyone who has accepted Jesus as Savior. Your understanding of the awesome nature of these blessings is limited only by your finite mind. The Amplified Bible Classic puts it this way: Ephesians 3:20 Amplified Bible (AMPC)

Now to Him Who, by (in consequence of) the [action of His] power that is at work within us, is able to [carry out His purpose and] do superabundantly, far over and above all that we [dare] ask or think [infinitely beyond our highest prayers, desires, thoughts, hopes, or dreams]

B. Partnering with God for Salvation.

Eph 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: [it is] the gift of God:

Eph 2:9 Not of works, lest any man should boast.

Rom 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

Rom 10:10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

C. Partnering with God on the fundamentals of Life.

To partner with God on a promise is to know it, believe it, speak it and act on it. 1Jo 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us [our] sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

1 Pet 2:24 I have been healed by the stripes (wounds) of Jesus.

Phi 4:19 But my God shall supply all my need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

Psalm 91:10 In the Name of Jesus, there shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.

D. Your future in partnering with God.

Joh 8:31 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye <u>continue</u> in my word, [then] are ye my disciples indeed;

Joh 8:32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

<u>Continue</u>: stay, abide, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry for.

Recommendation: Learn the promises by reading the Bible daily.
