Salvation Under the New Testament

Review.

Salvation is focused on the saving from challenges, the process and the final goal.
Joh 3:16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Redemption is focused on the value of the ransom, the value of the ransomee and the purpose of the final goal.

Rev 21:7 He that overcometh (1 John 5:5) shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son.

The Final Goal.

Salvation.

So Jesus, the Last Adam (1 Cor 15:45), had to come to defeat Satan, the god of this world (2 Cor 4:4) and to redeem us so that we are no longer short of the glory of God (Rom 3:23). In dying as the perfect man-sacrifice, Jesus provided for us **full salvation by becoming our Jubilee**. This means He restored us to all the rights which God had given to mankind through Adam.

Rom 5:8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Rom 5:9 Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him.

Rom 5:10 For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

Redemption.

How wonderful is our Salvation in Jesus Christ; but praise God, how much more wonderful is our redemption in Christ Jesus; for, in being resurrected from the dead, Jesus brought us into the better promises of the New Covenant, which is living in the **Resurrection Power of Christ Jesus and obtaining a glorified body**.

Rom 8:32 He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?

A. Salvation under the New Covenant.

1. Complete Protection.

Luke 10:19 Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

Act 2:21 And it shall come to pass, [that] whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.

2. Divine Health.

Act 10:38 How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.

1 Pet 2:24 Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.

3. Financial Prosperity.

2Co 8:9 For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

Luk 6:38 Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.

4. Living without Dying.

Adam was created to live forever. Jesus restored that right to us.

Joh 11:26 And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?

Joh 8:51 Verily, verily, I say unto you, If a man keep my saying, he shall never see death.

1Co 15:51 Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep (*die*), but we shall all be changed,
