1. Only by pride cometh contention: but with the well advised is wisdom. Prov 13:10
2. But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also. Matt 5:39
3. And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also. Matt 5:40
4. Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven. Luke 6:37
5. Judge not, that ye be not judged. Matt 7:1
6. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again. Matt 7:2
7. And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Matt 7:3

Faith Action Plan:

- Pray in Tongues 1 hour per day or a minimum of 1x a week on your day off. However, try to speak in Tongues daily. (Ramp up by starting with 5 min, 15 min, 30 min, 60 min)
- Do at least 50 Unaware Sins Prayer (USPs) a day.
“Heavenly Father, in the Name of Jesus, I am not aware of any sins. In the Name of Jesus, thank You for cleansing me of all unrighteousness, according to 1 John 1:9.”
- Do 10 1 Cor 2:16 affirmations: “In the Name of Jesus, I have the Mind of Christ.”
- Do 10 affirmations daily of Psalm 19:14 (which takes approx. 5-7 minutes to say out loud):
“In the Name of Jesus, God has made the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart pleasing to Him.”
- Do 10 Gal 5:22-23 affirmations: I’n the Name of Jesus, the Holy Spirit helps me to operate in the Fruit of the Spirit in love, joy, peace, patience, gentleness, goodness, faith, humility, and self-control.”
