

Consistency

A. Definition

- 1. Webster: Consistency is steady conformity to character, profession, belief or custom; steady continuity; free from irregularity
- 2. General: Keep doing what you are supposed to be doing without change, interruption, wavering, or giving up.
- 3. For a Christian, consistency is of utmost importance in areas of reading the Bible, **attending church**, praying, affirmations, **Godly conversations**, standing in faith, growing in the Fruit of the Spirit, confessing sins, tithing.

B. Receiving from God

- 1. Without faith, it is impossible to please God. (1st of the two Power Twins) Heb 11:6 a
 - a) Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not yet seen. Heb 11:1
 - Substance is essential nature or fundamental quality (i.e., it does not change).
 - b) Faith is leaning with your entire personality on God with absolute trust. Heb 6:12 Amp
 - Entire means having no element nor part left out (i.e., it has no interruptions).
 - Absolute trust means no wavering and no giving up.
- 2. God rewards those who diligently seek Him.

Heb 11:6 c

- a) Diligent: Persevering application. **Note**: disciples get set free by continuing. John 8:31-32
- b) Diligence: Steady, earnest and energetic application and effort

A share in the heavenly kingdom is sought with most **ardent zeal** Mt 11:12 Amp **and intense exertion.**

3. Ask in faith without wavering for double-minded men receive nothing from God. Jam 1:6-8

C. Growing in God

- 1. Love
 - a) God is love and God never changes. He is consistent

1 John 4:8

- b) Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 1 Cor 13:7
- 2. Patience (2nd of the two Power Twins)
 - a) Patience is joyful (i.e., cheerful despite opposition) endurance (continued application).
 - b) Patience is waiting **without wavering** for the manifestation of God's promise Heb 6:12 or something even better after the Prayer of Faith has been prayed. Mark 11:24
- 3. Fruit of the Spirit get on the escalator

Gal 5:22-23

- a) Increase in Love, joy, peace Patience, gentleness, goodness Faith, humility, self-control. The **spiritual** foundation is Love.
- b) The **personal** foundation is Self-control, which is restraint over one's own impulses, emotions or desires *on a consistent basis*.

D. Clinging to God

- 1. Jesus is our Living Hope. Hope is confident expectation (i.e., not wishy-washy). 1 Pet 1:3
- 2. Obedience is hearing and willingly obeying all the time (i.e., consistently). (17x). Ex 15:26; Ex 23:25
- 3. Spiritual Warfare
 - a) Exercise of your will Every time you resist sin, it strengthens your will; every time you give in, it strengthens the will of the demons. Resist consistently.
 - b) Confusion in mind The demons don't really care what you do as long as you obey them. **Fear, confusion and distraction are the enemies of consistency**. Check your thoughts against the Word of God consistently and diligently.
 - c) Iniquity in heart Iniquity is a crooked way of thinking, which comes from ungodly beliefs in your heart. What you think in your heart must be consistently validated against Truth (i.e., against what Jesus said).
