C. Living Plan A in the Ending Days

- 1. Protect your Garden
 - a) Protecting your household (i.e., sphere of influence) depends on your protecting your body, which is the temple of God, from all sin and evil. Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and *that* the Spirit of God dwells in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which *temple* ye are.
 - b) Flee sexual sin 1 Cor 6:17-20

But he that is joined unto the Lord is one spirit.

Flee fornication. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that commits fornication sins against his own body.

What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost *which is* in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?

For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

c) Sexual immorality abounds more and more. As it was in the days of Noah, Luk 17:26 so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man ... married & given in marriage.

2. Dwell in Christ

- a) If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.
- b) The Holy Spirit dwells in your spirit, which is perfect without sin.c) Whosoever abides in Him does not sin.1 John 3:6
- d) Whosoever is born of God does not commit sin; for his seed remains in him: 1 John 3:9 and he cannot sin, because he is born of God.
- e) But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwells in you.

3. Target Perfection

- a) Desire to be perfect in Christ.
 - God told Abraham to be perfect.
 Enoch and Elijah were taken by God (i.e., raptured).
 Jesus told us to be perfect even as our Heavenly Father is perfect.
 Matt 5:48
- b) Let the Holy Spirit change you.
 - 1) Are you so foolish and so senseless and so silly? Having begun [your new life spiritually] with the [Holy] Spirit, are you now reaching perfection [by dependence] on the flesh?
 - 2) For by one offering he has perfected for ever them that are sanctified.
 3) We shall not all die but we shall all be changed.
 4 1 Cor 15:51
- c) Earnestly desire to be alive and remain when Jesus returns. 1 Thes 4:15,17
 - 1) Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we 1 John 3:2 shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.
 - 2) Every man that hath this hope in him **purifies himself, even as he is pure.**1 John 3:3-5 Whosoever commits sin transgresses also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law.
 - Ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin.
 - 3) Whosoever abides in him sins not: whosoever sins hath not seen him, neither known him.
 - 4) Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.
