

Does God Want You Healed?

A. God's will for Healing

- 1) In the Beginning.
 - a) In the Garden of Eden, there was no sickness nor disease. It was very good. Gen 1:31
 - Spiritual death came on the day that Adam sinned. Gen 2:17
 - Without the connection to the life of God, Adam physically died 930 years later. Gen 5:5
 - b) God's plan was for man to live forever in dominion without sickness and death. Gen 1:26, 28
- 2) At the End.
 - a) And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain. Rev 21:4
- 3) Today.
 - a) After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. **Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.** Matt 6:9-10
 - b) It is very clear that God wants us to live today as it is in Heaven and that there is no sickness nor disease nor death in Heaven.

B. Jesus came to do God's will

- 1) God sent Jesus to redeem us from the results of sin.
 - a) For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3:16
 - b) For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved. John 3:17
- 2) The results of sin are the works of the devil.
 - a) For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil. 1Jn 3:8
- 3) Healing is a result of sin.
 - a) How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and **healing all** that were oppressed of the devil. Act 10:38

C. The Story of Healing

- 1) Messianic Prophecy about 700 years before the cross.
 - a) Surely he hath borne our griefs (disease, sickness), and carried our sorrows (pain): yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. Isa 53:4
 - b) But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and **with his stripes we are healed.** Isa 53:5
- 2) Jesus fulfilled the Prophecy.
 - a) When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed **all** that were sick: Mat 8:16
 - b) That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses. Mat 8:17
- 3) Today, looking back at the cross.
 - a) Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye **were** healed. 1Pe 2:24

D. Healing in the ministry of Jesus

- 1) Who did Jesus heal?
 - a) Jesus healed everyone, who asked Him.
And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick. Mat 14:14
And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off: Lk 17:12-14
And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.
And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests.
And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed.
 - b) Jesus healed everyone who acted in faith around Him.
And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken it up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee. Mar 2:4-5
 - c) Jesus could not do any great work of healing in Nazareth because of their unbelief. Mark 6:5
- 2) Healing is the children's bread. Mt 15:22-28
 - a) Healing for believers is so important that Jesus called healing the children's bread.
 - b) Even a person outside the covenant (i.e., not a Jew nor born again) can receive healing if persistent in hisr faith.
- 3) Be not afraid; only believe. Mk 5:35-36
 - a) According to their faith (in God's Word), they were healed Mt 9:27-30
 - b) Fear is the great enemy of faith. Just trust God and believe His promises.
