

What is Praise and Worship?

Overview: "Praise and Worship" is not just one thing. There is a process, a spiritual flow toward God of praises, moving into the sweet-smelling savor of worship, which gradually permeates the very Throne Room of God.

A. GLORY: EXPERIENCING the ATMOSPHERE of HEAVEN by Ruth Ward Heflin

- 1. "Every service needs both praise and worship. We praise until the spirit of worship comes and then we worship until the Glory comes."
 - 2. Another ministry is quoted as saying that "we believe that, if we praise until the spirit of worship comes and then worship until the Glory comes, we can stand in the Glory and see the fullness of God."
 - 3. Another view: PRAISE until you enter WORSHIP; WORSHIP until you build the ANOINTING; build the ANOINTING until you enter the GLORY.
 - 4. PRAISE until you enter the ANOINTING; then WORSHIP until you enter the GLORY.
 - 5. PRAISE> WORSHIP> ANOINTING> GLORY!!! 2 Chron 5:11-14 Ampl
 - 6. Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courtyard with the sacrifice of praise. Keep praising until you enter the temple with worship; then continue through the Holy Place (i.e., the priestly area) with medium worship until high worship ushers you into the very presence of the Living God in the Holy of Holies.

B. DEFINITIONS

- PRAISE is the process of exalting God for His mighty acts and His wondrous works: (Webster: to commend the worth of; to express approval or admiration of; to laud the glory of God).
 Ps 150:2; 22:3 KJV&NKJ
- WORSHIP is the process of honoring God for Who He is: (Webster: honor, dignity, extreme devotion, intense love for or admiration of God). Holy --- Rev 15:4
