

Attitudes for Victory

Overview: What is it that sets a superconqueror above the rest? It is their attitude! They know who they are in Christ, they know the promises of the Word and they are going after it with all they have. These two basic attitudes of fleeing sin and pursuing righteousness are keys to victorious living.

A. Fleeing and Pursuing – Two Attitudes, But One Action.

Flee pheugō Apparently a primary verb; to *run away* (literally or figuratively); by implication to *shun*; by analogy to *vanish:* - escape, flee (away).

Flee – Present active indicative – continue to flee, flee and keep fleeing.

Follow diōkō a prolonged (and causative) form of a primary verb $\delta i \omega$ diō (to *flee*; compare the base of <u>G1169</u> and <u>G1249</u>); to *pursue* (literally or figuratively); by implication to *persecute:* - ensue, follow (after), given to, (suffer) persecute (-ion), press toward.

Follow – Present active imperative – pursuing, as in a race – with persistence and intensity.

2 Tim 2:22 Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.

1 Tim 6:10-11 For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But thou, O man of God, **flee** these things; and **follow after** righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness.

1Pe 3:11 Let him eschew evil, and do good; let him seek peace, and ensue it.

Rom 12:9 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.
